



1.2. Intended Use

This device is intended for professional use as a connection element for trusses in the entertainment technology. It shall be used only on steel or aluminum round tubes. Any other use, not mentioned under intended use, is regarded as non-intended and incorrect use.

1.3. Text Conventions

Throughout the user manual the following text conventions are used:

- References: References to chapters and parts of the device are in bold lettering, for example: "Refer to 2. Safety", "turn the adjustment screw (02)"
- 0–255: Defines a range of values
- Notes: Note: (in bold lettering) is followed by useful information or tips





The Multigrip Clamp is a connection element for trusses in the entertainment technology. It is suitable for use with steel or aluminum tubes and beams.





4. Installation

4.1. Safety Instructions for Installation



WARNING

Incorrect installation can cause serious injuries and damage of property.

Installation must be carried out only by instructed or skilled persons.

Follow all applicable European, national and local safety regulations concerning rigging and trussing.

4.2. Personal Protective Equipment

During installation and rigging wear personal protective equipment in compliance with the national and site-specific regulations.

4.3. Mounting



CAUTION Restrict the access under the work area during installation/deinstallation.



Attention

Do not use brute force when loosening or tightening the nuts/bolts.

Do not exceed the recommended tightening torque: 30 N m (22 lb-ft).



The device can be mounted on round tubes and flat surfaces (with the supplied wedge or with the optional spigots). You can also attach 2 devices to each other to create a swivel coupler. See **3.4. Optional Accessories** on page 6 for more information. Choose the preferred installation method before mounting the device and use only the accessories suitable for the installation method of your choice. Remove and store the unused accessories.


Notes:

- Secure the load with a secondary suspension, for example a safety cable. Make sure that the secondary suspension can hold 10 times the weight of the load. If possible, the secondary suspension should be attached to a supporting structure independent of the primary suspension. If possible, put the safety cable through the safety eye.
- Make sure that the WLL of any installed accessory/device is not exceeded.

4.3.1. Mounting on Round Tubes

To mount the device, follow the steps below:

- 01) Turn the mounting screw (01) counterclockwise, to loosen the device.
- 02) Attach a load to the mounting threads: 16 mm (5/8") hexagon socket (07), M5 threads (08/09) or the UNC 1/4" 20 thread (10).
- 03) Put the device, with the installed load, around a tube (Ø 10–55 mm).
- 04) Turn the **mounting screw (01)** clockwise, to tighten the device around the tube.






4.3.2. Mounting on Flat Surfaces


It is possible to install the device on flat surfaces with the supplied wedge (04).

To mount the device, follow the steps below:

- 01) Turn the spigot mounting screw (05) counterclockwise to remove it.
- 02) Remove the wedge (04) located under the spigot mounting screw (05). See Fig. 06.
- 03) Insert the wedge (04) into the mounting holes on the device. See Fig. 06.



- 04) Turn the mounting screw (01) counterclockwise, to loosen the device.
- 05) Attach a load to the mounting threads: 16 mm (5/8") hexagon socket (07), M5 threads (08/09) or the UNC 1/4" 20 thread (10).
- 06) Put the device, with the installed load, around the surface (10–55 mm).
- 07) Turn the mounting screw (01) clockwise, to tighten fit the device firmly to the surface. See Fig. 07.






4.3.3. Mounting with the Dedicated Spigots

It is possible to use the device with the optional spigots (75133) and (75134). See **3.4. Optional Accessories** on page 6 for more information

- 01) Mount the device on a tube or a flat surface. See **4.3.1. Mounting on Round Tubes** and **4.3.2. Mounting on Flat Surfaces** on pages 8–9 for more information.
- 02) Mount the spigot on a load.
- 03) Turn the spigot mounting screw (05) counterclockwise to loosen it completely.
- 04) Press and hold down the safety pin (06) and insert the spigot with the attached load into the 16 mm (5/8") hexagon socket (07).
- 05) Release the **safety pin (06)**, to fit the spigot in position.
- 06) Turn the **spigot mounting screw (05)** clockwise, to stabilize the spigot in the **16 mm (5/8") hexagon socket (07)**.






4.3.4. Mounting Two Devices with the Spigot

It is possible to connect 2 devices with the spigot (75134), to create a swivel coupler.

- 01) On both devices, turn the the **spigot mounting screws (05)** counterclockwise, to loosen them completely.
- 02) On one of the 2 devices, press and hold down the **safety pin (06)**.
- 03) Insert the spigot into the 16 mm (5/8") hexagon socket (07).
- 04) Release the safety pin (06), to fit the spigot in position.
- 05) Turn the spigot mounting screw (05) clockwise, to stabilize the spigot in the socket.
- 06) On the other device, press and hold down the safety pin (06)
- 07) Attach the previously mounted spigot to the 16 mm (5/8") hexagon socket (07).
- 08) Release the safety pin (06), to fit the device to the spigot.
- 09) Turn the **spigot mounting screw (05)** clockwise, to stabilize the device on the spigot. Both devices are connected and form a swivel coupler.



Spigot for Multigrip Clamp (3/8"-16)




10) Set the connected devices to the desired position and angle.



4.3.5. Working Load Limit

When the device is installed in a vertical position, its WLL (Working Load Limit) is 25 kg.

This installation method does not put any additional strain on the system.







When the device is installed in a non-vertical position, its WLL becomes lower than 25 kg.

The actual WLL value differs per situation because it depends on many variables (e.g., the tube's surface finish, the torque applied when tightening the device, the inclination angle, etc.)







5. Inspection and Maintenance



Attention

Inspection and maintenance may be carried out only by instructed or skilled persons. Service shall be carried out only by skilled persons.

5.1. Inspection



Attention Before every use, examine the device visually for any defects

Regular and periodic inspections shall be carried out throughout the period of service of the device. The frequency of the inspections depends on the inspection schedule established for the site where the device is installed.

- Check the device for damage, cracks and corrosion. If any fault is found, mark the device clearly and remove it from service.
- Do not use the device if it is damaged.

5.2. Corrective Maintenance

- Do not modify the device.
- Refer repairs and servicing to skilled persons. Contact your Highlite International dealer for more information.

5.3. Basic Cleaning Instructions

- Use a damp cloth to clean the device.
- Do not use alcohol, solvents or abrasive agents.



6. Deinstallation, Transportation and Storage

6.1. Instructions for Deinstallation



WARNING

Incorrect deinstallation can cause serious injuries and damage of property.

- Restrict the access under the working area during deinstallation.
- Always observe the national and site-specific regulations during deinstallation of the device.
- Wear personal protective equipment in compliance with the national and site-specific regulations.

6.2. Instructions for Transportation

Make sure that appropriate measures are taken to prevent damage to the device during transportation.

6.3. Storage

- Inspect the device for defects before storing. See **5.1**. Inspection on page 13 for more information.
- Clean the device before storing. Follow the cleaning instructions in chapter **5.3. Basic Cleaning Instructions** on page 13.
- Store the device in a dry, ventilated environment to avoid corrosion.

7. Disposal

After the device is removed from service it can be disposed of as scrap.





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
